Classroom Supplies

1. *Binder notebook with loose-leaf paper.*
2. **GRAPHING Composition Notebook**
3. *Pencils only—NO PENS!! Mechanical pencils are fine!*
4. *Calculator—simple and inexpensive is fine! Make sure it has a square root symbol ($\sqrt{\quad}$). A scientific calculator is great!*
